The Golf Journey of Ray and Ann Knowis

Growing up on farms in rural southern middle Tennessee we never thought of playing golf. Those years were spent working, doing the normal farm activities associated with growing crops of cotton, corn, tobacco, strawberries and raising cattle. Then, my engineering career brought me to AEDC in Tullahoma and subsequently to Micro Craft, Inc., an aerospace company where I was employed for 31 years, and Ann worked for the Tullahoma City School System. It was my job with Micro Craft that led to our introduction to golf. While working in California on one of Micro Craft's programs I became friends with one of the managers of Micro Craft's Ontario, California division, Gardner James. Gardner and his wife Pat were avid golfers. The Jameses owned a condo at a golf resort on the Big Island in Hawaii and extended an invitation to us to spend a vacation there; but told us that it was a golf resort and there was little else there to do. We told them that since we didn't play golf, we would surely find something else to do.

Upon awakening on the morning after arriving at the Sea Mountain Resort in Hawaii, we surveyed the surroundings and realized there really was little there to do except play golf and tour the island. The first day there we found that the closest place for lunch was at the golf course. After lunch, we were going through the golf pro shop looking at golf paraphernalia. The manager of the shop, a very friendly Hawaii native, asked if we were there to play golf. We responded "No, we don't play golf". I'm sure he must have wondered what are you doing here. Being a good manager, he suggested that we rent some clubs and give it a try. We did and so the journey began.

Going on the course with no lessons or instructions of any kind, we found the course to be so scenic there on the ocean and in sight of the Kilauea volcano that we couldn't help but fall in love with the game. While playing on that course you were listening to the sound of waves crashing on the shore and looking at black sand beaches. Ann was amazingly good as a first time, completely novice golfer. We played every day while there. Being able to enjoy a luau, featuring a roasted pig, in the evenings at the Black Sands Restaurant also enhanced the experience. What an awesome way to start our golf journey.

While awaiting departure from the island on Sunday, April 13, 1986, as now "experienced golfers" we watched Jack Nicklaus win the Masters at Augusta as he triumphantly raised his putter in the air. We were on our way home to start purchasing golf clubs. Of course, we started with inexpensive starter sets and started playing somewhat regularly and Ann was good enough that she deserved better clubs and got a set of top-of-the-line Calloway irons and driver. This boosted her confidence, and she became involved in the local women's league. My job with Micro Craft didn't allow me to play regularly locally but did provide me with an opportunity to play while on travel to many of the company's remote sites including Ohio, Virginia, and California.

After being introduced to the game of golf on our first trip to Hawaii where we stayed at the James's condo, they invited us to go back to Hawaii the following year for a 3-week golf vacation. We gladly accepted and played golf on Oahu's North Shore, several courses on the Big Island and then on to the Island of Kauai playing several courses there including Poipu Bay which is one of my favorite courses in the country. Over the course of 15 years, we made several trips back to the Islands and played golf extensively on each trip. Pat and Gardner were always looking for new places to play golf and arranged trips into Nevada, Arizona and even into Canada where we played in the provinces of Alberta and British Columbia including Vancouver Island.

All our golf was not with Pat and Gardner. Ann and I arranged numerous trips on our own. One trip was to Seattle, Washington where we traveled down the range of mountains from Mount Rannier in Washington to Mount Shasta in California then back up the coast where we played the Dunes in Oregon. Similar trips were made to the New England area where we played in many states including Maine and the course at Bar Harbor. Side trips there included Acadia National Park and Mount Washington, the tallest mountain east of the Mississippi.

At some point Ann and I were discussing the number of states in which we had played, and Ann had been keeping track by using a map of the United States and placing a pin in the states in which we had played. Seeing that we had already played in a large number of the states we decided to commit to playing in all of the states. We had enjoyed all of our travel and golf, so it was an easy decision.

We wanted to see Glacier National Park in Montana. We had already seen Glacier, but we had seen it from Canada. I wanted to drive the "Going to the Sun Road" so a trip was planned that we combined with a Rotary Convention in Kansas City, MO. After the Rotary Convention we went across the river to Kansas City, KS and played a course there on Sunday morning. Finishing around noon we went on to Lincoln, NE, arriving midafternoon. With nothing else to do, we located a golf course for another round. On the 3rd hole that afternoon Ann had a hole-in-one, her second. On that trip to Glacier we played in 8 states. So now we were really getting close, and we were finally down to 4 remaining states: Oklahoma, New Mexico, Michigan, and Alaska. Now those states are just not normally travelled through from Tennessee, so we had to do some planning to play there. As it turned out we had to make individual trips to accomplish our goal.

First, it was a trip to Oklahoma in September of 2019 where we played a course on the Cherokee Nation called Cherokee Springs. With COVID-19 being a challenge in 2020 we did not travel but in March 2021 we decided to go to Albuquerque, New Mexico and play the University of New Mexico Championship Course. Now down to only two (2) left, we traveled to Augusta to play our 49th state, that was Augusta, Michigan, in early May.

With only Alaska remaining, we could wait no longer and we started planning that trip. Where in Alaska should we go was the question. So, thinking back to the courses we had played, Sea Mountain on the southern tip of the Big Island of Hawaii (where we had actually started), then Poipu Bay on the western side of Kahui and the Bar Harbor course in eastern Maine, we had played the southernmost, the westernmost, and the easternmost courses in the US, so why not play the northernmost. An Internet search found a course in Fairbanks, Alaska, that had the distinction as being the northernmost. That became our destination, and we began planning the trip.

On September 2, 2021, we played the course in Fairbanks on a gloomy, drizzly day with lots of water standing on the course. We played in our 50th state. Ann birdied the final hole. A very nice way to finish. Dan and Fran Marcum accompanied us on the trip to Alaska and played with us in our 50th state, making that experience even more enjoyable. While in Fairbanks, we had the opportunity to tour Denali and spend 3 nights searching for the Aurora Borealis. Quite a way to end our Golf Journey.




Greens & Grounds Committee - Dave Hamann/Clay Uselton


Least Putts Playoff


